Non-Preference Enrolment Policy

A requirement of Section (29)1 of the Integration Act is that all pupils shall be enrolled as either preference or non preference students.

All state-integrated schools have places for non preference students. Our integration agreement allows for no more than 10% of the maximum school roll to be from non-preference students. Non-preference students will be enrolled only if enrolment places remain after all preference applicants have been enrolled.



All applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

- 1. Students of parents who are active members of the Founding Churches (Hope Centre and Discovery Elim Christian Centre)
- 2. Students of parents who are active members of other Pentecostal churches
- 3. Students of parents who are active members of churches of similar basis of faith to the founding churches
- 4. Students of parents who are not members of any Christian church

Siblings of students do not have their own priority category, the siblings will fit into the priority categories above and go through the normal enrolment process.

If there is no space for an enrolment acceptance, a family can choose to be placed on a waiting list. The enrolments placed on the waiting list are listed in their priority rankings and dated. Enrolments on the waiting list are contacted as places become available.

All enrolment applicants accept that they will be attending a School of Special Character and that their place in the school is conditional on their participation in program and they accept that they will be required to pay Attendance Dues to the Proprietor and these are not voluntary.

The enrolment policy applies to all applications for all year groups in the school.
